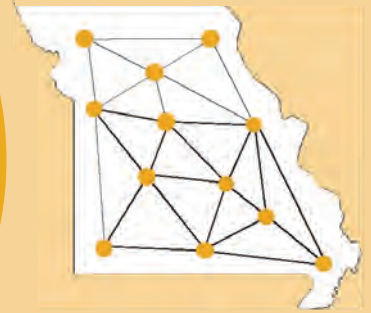

### June

#### MO Moms & Babies

Addressed perinatal COVID-19 care by sharing evidence-based practices, innovation, collaboration & community networks.



### September

#### COVID-19 & Kids

Shares latest developments, answers questions, & discusses management to support school and health professionals.



### November

#### Nursing Home COVID-19 Action Network ECHO

Focuses on reducing isolation, early identification, prevention of spread & appropriate care to residents with mild & asymptomatic cases.

#### Managing Hospitals & Patients in a Pandemic

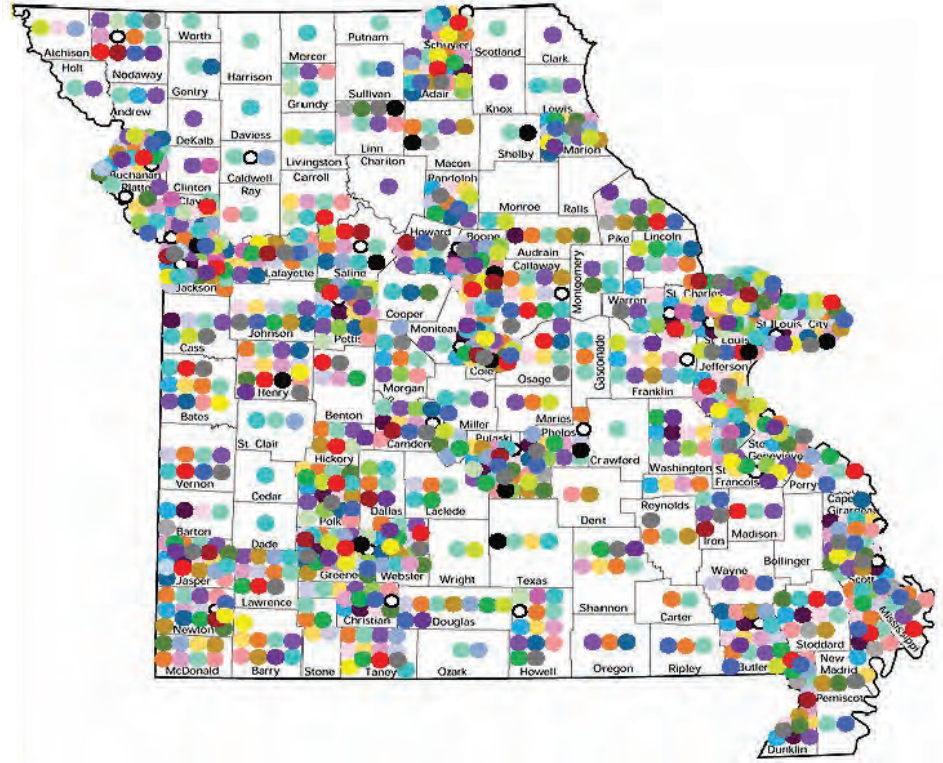
Optimizing personnel, places & resources used for patient care & transitions at hospitals, long-term acute facilities & rehabilitation centers.
